**Shahadah** – is one of the 5 Pillars. An expression of faith

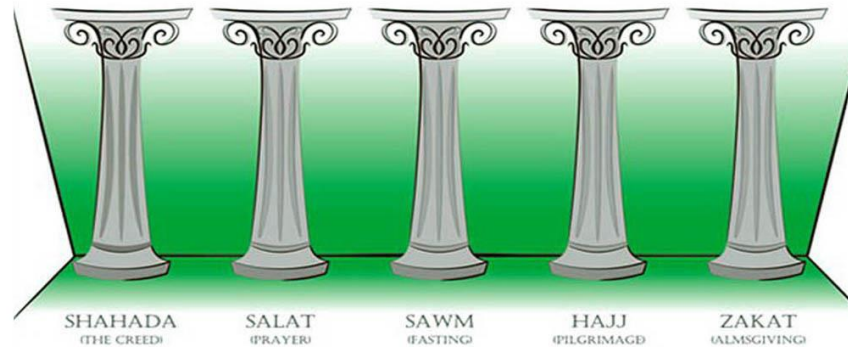
**Muhammad** – last prophet

**Manger** – is a rack to hold food for animals. Comes from the French word 'manger' to eat.

**Advent** - the first season of the church year.



Advent wreath

**The Advent wreath** is a circular garland of evergreen branches representing eternity.

In the four weeks leading up to Christmas, one candle is lit each Sunday.

These candles represent a particular part of the preparation for the coming of Jesus.

**Mary Magdalene** –follower of Jesus

**Crucifixion** – an ancient form of execution

**Disciples** –personal follower of Jesus

**Salvation** – means being saved from harm

**Resurrection**- the rising of Jesus

**Good Friday** -Christian holiday commemorated during Holy week

**Easter Sunday**- commemorated as the day Jesus rose from the dead.

**The empty cross** – Jesus did not stay on the cross

**Purple** – royalty – the Son of God who died on the Cross.

**Lilies** - the pure new life that comes to them through the Resurrection of Jesus.

## What is the 'good news' Christians say Jesus brings?

Concept – Living a good life(RE2)

### Vocabulary

**Gospel** – good news

**Forgiveness**- to stop feeling resentful of someone's actions.

**Peace** – when conflict stops

**Conflict** – argument/disagreement

**Belief** – accept that something is true without proof.



Christians believe Jesus brings good news for all people:

- For Christians, this good news includes being loved by God, and being forgiven for bad things.
- Christians believe Jesus is a friend to the poor and friendless.
- Christians believe Jesus' teachings make people think hard about how to live and show them the right way.

**Oratory** – a small chapel used for private worship.

**Sacred** – connected to God and regarded with respect.
